## PA approves outline application for sea passenger terminal

The Planning Authority yesterday approved an outline application for a Lm10 million sea passenger terminal at Pinto Wharf in Valletta.

The development was proposed by the VISET Consortium which combines Mal-tese with foreign investment. At a public hearing at St Francis Ravelin in Floriana, the PA board

Ravelin in Floriana, the PA board unanimously approved the permit after Robert Vella from the Plan-ning Directorate recommended approval, subject to a list of con-ditions.

The outline application was for the development of a cruise passenger and ferry terminal including related leisure and commercial facilities and the construction of a car park and leisure facilities in Crucifix Basion

The developers withdrew part of the application for the construc-tion of a tunnel and access road in Magazine bastion and Crucifix Bas-

from the US, Spain, France and Hong Kong.
In recommending approval the Planning Directorate said that a full development permission
would be awarded subject to a traffic impact statement to determine the type and extent of any
traffic junction improvement which will be required
to accommodate the additional traffic expected to
be generated by the development.
The PA reserved the right to withdraw the
permit for the car park if works would affect heritage sites.

The directorate also said that the views of the bastions and the historic buildings from the Grand Harbour would be taken into account in the assessment of the full development application.
Yesterday's hearing was not controversial by nor-

mal standards, but the project met with stiff opposition from Valletta resident Miriam Cremona who claimed that the development was to the detrimen of Valletta.

The building to house the terminal would ruit the view of the fortifications, she said.
Environment Minister Francis Zammit Dimed said earlier this month that negotiations between the government and VISET for the construction of the Valletta cruise liner terminal were expected to be concluded before the end of February.
The process of public consultations would stat shortly after, and Dr Zammit Dimech said he hoped that work would start by the end of the year.
The PA also approved in principle an outlindevelopment permit for the construction of office to house the Malta Martime Authority and other leated bodies at Gas Works, Pinto Street, Marsa The directorate had expressed itself in favour of this development within certain parameters includ
